Get a Library Card



To access everything the library has to offer, you'll need a <u>free</u> library card.

All residents of Saskatoon can get a free library card by registering online or in person at any library. We also offer institution cards for organizations and daycares and educational cards for teachers.

To register, you'll just need a piece of government-issued identification and proof of Saskatoon address. If you don't have proof of address on your identification, you can bring a utility bill or some form of government correspondence. Application forms are available in French, Cree, Mandarin, Ukrainian and Russian, in addition to English.



Rapid Access Counselling


